FASTING ON THE ROAD TO REDEMPTION

Abstinence is the practice of eating no meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays during Lent and is required of all Catholics age 14 and older.

Fasting is the practice of eating only one full meal and two others that do not equal a full meal. It is an obligation for all Catholics from ages 18 to 59. While we are required to fast on these specific days, (Ash Wednesday and Good Friday), the entire Season of Lent should be marked by fasting in different ways. Why do we fast? We fast in sacrifice to make up for sin as well as to remind ourselves that only Jesus can satisfy the hunger of our hearts. We can fast from anything that we enjoy: certainly our favorite candy or treat, but also a TV show that we always watch, going to the movies, listening to music, etc. Fasting creates space in our lives and hearts for Jesus.
