He is faithful from age to age.

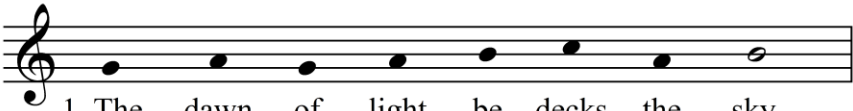

and will be for ever. Amen.

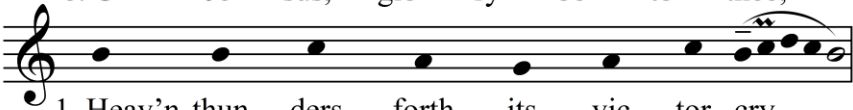

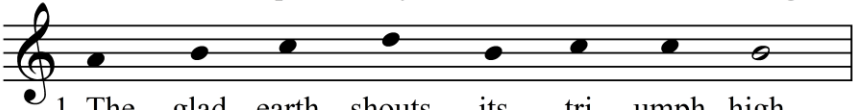

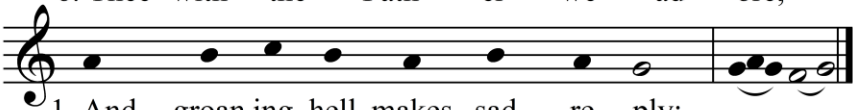

Right side: All you beasts, wild and tame, bless the Lord.
You sons of men, bless the Lord.

Left side: O Israel, bless the Lord;
praise and exalt him above all forever.

Right side: Priests of the Lord, bless the Lord.
Servants of the Lord, bless the Lord.

Left side: Spirits and souls of the just, bless the Lord.
Holy men of humble heart, bless the Lord.

Right side: Hananiah, Azariah, Mishael, bless the Lord;
praise and exalt him above all forever.

Left side: Let us bless the Father, and the Son,
and the Holy Spirit:
Let us praise and exalt him above all forever.

Right side: Blessed are you, Lord, in the firmament of heaven,
Praiseworthy and glorious
and exalted above all for ever.

**All: Our Redeemer has risen from the tomb;

Cantor: Alleluia, the Lord is risen as he promised, alleluia.

PSALM 149

Left side: Sing a new song to the Lord,
his praise in the assembly of the faithful.

Right side: Let Israel rejoice in its Maker,
let Zion's sons exult in their king.

Left side: Let them praise his name with dancing
and make music with timbrel and harp.

Right side: For the Lord takes delight in his people.
He crowns the poor with salvation.

Left side: Let the faithful rejoice in their glory,
shout for joy and take their rest.

Right side: Let the praise of God be on their lips
and a two-edged sword in their hand,

Left side: to deal out vengeance to the nations
and punishment on all the peoples;

Right side: to bind their kings in chains
and their nobles in fetters of iron;

Left side: to carry out the sentence pre-ordained:
this honor is for all his faithful.

Right side: Glory to the Father, and to the Son,
and to the Holy Spirit:

Left side: As it was in the beginning, is now,
and will be forever. Amen.

All: Alleluia, the Lord is risen as he promised, alleluia.

GOSPEL CANTICLE (LUKE 1:68-79)

STAND

Sunday of the Resurrection: Very early on the morning
after the Sabbath, when the sun had just risen,
they came to the tomb, alleluia.

Monday: Go quickly and tell his disciples:
The Lord is risen, alleluia.

Tuesday: Jesus called her by name: Mary. She turned to him
and said: Rabboni. Then he said to her: Do not touch
me; I have not yet ascended to my Father, alleluia.

Wednesday: Beginning with Moses and the prophets,
Jesus interpreted for them all that had been written of
him in the Scriptures, alleluia.

Thursday: Jesus stood in the midst of his disciples and said:
Peace be with you, alleluia.

Friday: This was the third time Jesus had shown himself to his
disciples after he had risen from the dead, alleluia.

Saturday: When Jesus had risen from the dead on the morning
after the Sabbath, he appeared first to Mary
Magdalene, from whom he had cast out seven devils,
alleluia.

2nd Sunday of Easter: With your hand, touch the marks of the nails;
doubt no longer, but believe, alleluia.

All make the Sign of the Cross at the beginning of the Canticle.

All: ✠ **Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel;
he has come to his people and set them free.**

**He has raised up for us a mighty savior,
born of the house of his servant David.**

**Through his holy prophets he promised of old
that he would save us from our enemies,
from the hands of all who hate us.**

**He promised to show mercy to our fathers
and to remember his holy covenant.**

**This was the oath he swore to our father Abraham:
to set us free from the hands of our enemies,
free to worship him without fear,
holy and righteous in his sight
all the days of our life.**

**You, my child,
shall be called the prophet of the Most High;
for you will go before the Lord
to prepare his way,
to give his people knowledge of salvation
by the forgiveness of their sins.**

**In the tender compassion of our God
the dawn from on high shall break upon us,
to shine on those who dwell in darkness
and the shadow of death,
and to guide our feet into the way of peace.**

**Glory to the Father, and to the Son,
and to the Holy Spirit:
As it was in the beginning, is now
and will be forever. Amen**

2nd Sunday of Easter: **Give us, Lord,
the glory of your Son.**
